SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Bellefontaine High School is a comprehensive public high school and is the only high school in the Bellefontaine City School District. Vocational students may attend Ohio Hi-Point Career Center. The city of Bellefontaine has a population of approximately 13,000, and is the seat of Logan County. Most of the residents of the school district work in industry, business, or service occupations. Some residents are also employed in agriculture. All levels of socio-economic background are represented. Minorities represent about 8% of the population of the city. Bellefontaine is located 50 miles northwest of Columbus, Ohio.

SCHEDULE

Bellefontaine High School is on a modified block schedule. The day consists of a combination of 40-minute periods and 80-minute double periods, or blocks. There is also a 25-minute Activity & Intervention period (A/I) built into the schedule. Most academic classes meet for one semester 80-minute block or one yearlong 40-minute period.

GRADING, GPA, CLASS RANK

There are three six-week grading periods per semester for all classes. Advanced Placement (AP) and College Credit Plus (CCP) courses are weighted by adding .03125 to the cumulative GPA. All courses are included in the GPA and class rank.
